Most Important Symptoms: Irritation to mucous membrane, eyes and skin. Severe irritation of mouth, throat, esophagus and stomach. Bloating or stomach, belching, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. Severe eye irritation, watering and redness. Can cause burns to eye. slight nose and throat irritation.
